

NORFOLK SUZUKI VIOLIN CAMP 2026

At Langley School, Loddon, South Norfolk from

Come and learn from a great team of inspiring teachers and immerse yourselves in a variety of music making including Suzuki group lessons, ensemble and orchestra playing, folk session tunes, Improvisation, Individual lessons, round singing, drumming and concerts.

Accommodation options and facilities

Choose between sleeping in a private family room in the main house or bring a tent to camp with use of the nearby facilities. (There will only be space for two camper vans so if you wish to bring a van please let me know asap – otherwise there is plenty of tent space) All your meals are provided in the dining hall and we will have access to the sports facilities for use in your free time including tennis courts, football pitches, indoor sports hall for basketball and beautiful grounds to explore. There will also be craft activities on offer for those who prefer a quieter breaktime.

Our lessons and workshops will be housed across the school buildings which have ample class rooms, a ballroom for concerts and larger groups, and plenty of communal spaces for gathering in between classes. There are also extensive grounds and gardens with areas of woodland to explore and nice quiet places to relax in between activities.

The Timetable

Each student will be given a timetable providing a variety of musical activities tailored to their age and level. This will include a Suzuki group lesson and an individual lesson and at least two musicianship classes (improv, drumming, folk, ensemble, orchestra). There will also be a play together every morning covering book 1-5 repertoire. The course is relatively small which means that we can build the course around the students, ensuring a personalized experience! The evenings are for concerts, socialising and impromptu music making, We can accommodate Twinklers to book 5.

Parents who are having violin lessons themselves are also welcome to apply as participants and any cello or viola playing parents and siblings can be drafted in to ensembles if willing. Non-Suzuki siblings who play cello or viola are welcome to apply as participants and will be given a reduced timetable. As well as the regular daily timetable there will be concerts, play togethers, round singing, a folk session hosted by Rosie (fiddle), Chris (guitar), Tess and Sebastian (flute and whistles) with the tunes provided well in advance of the course, so everyone can learn as many as they want to and join in.
