

To become an Honorary Member of the European Suzuki Association (ESA), an individual must demonstrate an outstanding contribution to the development of the SUZUKI[™] Method in the ESA region and/or a significant contribution to the advancement of the ESA.

<u>Key Criteria</u>

• Outstanding Contribution to the SUZUKI[™] Method

- The nominee should have played a key role in expanding or strengthening the SUZUKI™ Method on a European or even International level.
- Actively fostered connections and exchanges between countries, encouraging collaboration and growth within the Suzuki community in the region.
- The contribution should be widely recognized and have a lasting impact.

• Significant Contribution to ESA

- The nominee should have actively supported the ESA's mission and objectives through their exceptional service to the organisation.
- This could involve serving on committees or boards, pioneering new instruments or training programs, involvement in regional events and contributing to the administrative or institutional development of the organisation.

Other factors

• Nominations

- Nominations are expected to be submitted by existing ESA members.
- The ESA Board will review all nominations and make the final decision.
- Honorary membership is a high honour and is not meant to be awarded frequently.

• Privileges

- Honorary members usually do not pay fees.
- They often receive honorary recognition and may be invited to special events.
